PRESS RELEASE

For Immediate Release January 26, 2010

On Tuesday January 19, 2010, the Carver Police Department received a report of an Unarmed Robbery at Delta Gas located at 303 Tremont Street in South Carver. Officer David Harriman and Officer Derrick Ostiguy responded to the area. The 22 year old attendant at Delta Gas reported that he had heard a noise outside. He stated he went outside the building to investigate the noise and was jumped by two white males. The attendant stated that the males, appeared to have their faces covered, began to punch him in the face and knocked him to the ground. One of the suspects held the attendant down on the ground, while the second demanded money and went through his pockets. After taking cash from the attendant, the two males fled on foot, South on Tremont Street toward Wareham. The attendant was treated at the scene by Carver EMS for minor injuries. He refused further medical treatment. Carver Police were assisted by the Plymouth County Sheriff's Department K9 Unit. The Plymouth County Sheriff's Department BCI Unit also assisted.

On January 20, 2010, Officer Harriman and Officer Ostiguy located and interviewed a witness. Based on information obtained from the victim, surveillance video from the area, and the witness' testimony, Officer Harriman was able to obtain arrest warrants for Justin Janczewski, age 22, of Carver and Nicholas "Nick" Nelson, age 19, of Carver. Janczewski and Nelson are both charged with Unarmed Robbery, Aggravated Assault to commit a felony, Larceny from the person over \$250, and Conspiracy to Commit Unarmed Robbery.

Justin Janczewski turned himself in to Carver Police on January 21, 2010. Nick Nelson was arrested by Sgt. Michael Miksch in Wareham on January 21, 2010. Janczewski and Nelson were transported to Wareham District Court and arraigned. He was held on \$2,500 cash bail. Nelson was held on \$1,000 cash bail.
